Some college applications may ask the following questions:

- Are you the dependent of a legal resident of North Dakota?
- Are you the dependent of a full-time active duty member or former military member?
- Are you the dependent of a graduate of a North Dakota University System institution?
- Are you the dependent of a benefited employee of North Dakota University System?
